WHO WAS ELLIJAH?

Elijah (born around 900BC) was a prophet in Israel roughly 100 years after the reign of King David. King David had established a kingdom in which the One God, the LORD, was worshipped alone. No other gods or religious cults were to be recognised in Israel apart from the religion of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob. Yet in a relatively short period of time after King David's death the kingdom had split into two parts, the North and the South, each with its own king. King Ahab in the north allowed his wife, Queen Jezebel, to set up shrines and encourage worship of the god Baal. The people were turned away from the true religion of Israel. Elijah (whose name means My-God-is-the-LORD) was called to lead them back. In his mission he frequently came into conflict with the king and queen. On one dramatic occasion Elijah had gathered a great crowd of people on Mount Carmel and challenged hundreds of the prophets of the god Baal to a sacrifice-contest. Fire came down from the sky showing that Elijah's sacrifice to the LORD was accepted. The sacrifice of the prophets of Baal remained untouched. This showed that the LORD is the true God and Baal is a nothing. Jezebel was furious and had Elijah hunted down so that she could put him to death. The first reading today tells of that moment where Elijah is on the run, fearful for his life and exhausted. He is on the point of giving up. But God feeds him and encourages him. And on Mount Horeb God meets Elijah in the 'still small voice' of calm.
